Skip Pettit has been a consultant and trainer for 30 years. Beginning with the U.S. Department of Education's Drug Training and Resource Center in San Antonio, in 1973, he continues today to provide customized training services to more than 20 organizations worldwide.

In 1993, Skip formed the International Training Consortium, Inc., a talent-packed group of more than 100 of the top trainers and consultants from across the US. He still serves as its founder and President.

Mr. Pettit completed Mental Health and Psychology degrees in 1977 from Montgomery College and Antioch University, and two Masters Degrees in Counseling and Personnel Services in 1982, from the University of Maryland.
